Wheeler, Esq., treated by this Court as a petition to invoke its all writs jurisdiction, is hereby stricken as unauthorized as the petition was not signed by a member of The Florida Bar appearing on behalf of the corporate petitioner. See, e.g., Richter v. Higdon Homes, Inc., 544 So. 2d 300, 300 (Fla. 1st DCA 1989)("A corporation may not represent itself through non-lawyer employees, officers, or shareholders."); Daytona Migi Corp. v. Daytona Automotive Fiberglass, Inc., 417 So. 2d 272, 274 (Fla. 5th DCA 1982) ("A corporation must be represented in court by an attorney and may not be represented by a

				corporate officer."); Quinn v. Housing Auth. Of the City of Orlando, 385 So. 2d 1167, 1167 (Fla. 5th DCA 1980)("A corporation is not a person and, therefore, a corporation cannot designate a non-attorney employee to represent it. Instead, a corporation must be represented by an attorney."), Petitioner is allowed to and including July 21, 2004, in which to file a proper petition for writ of mandamus, that complies with Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.100, and this order. The failure to file a proper petition with this Court within the time provided could result in the imposition of sanctions, including dismissal of this case. See Fla. R. App. P. 9.410.
