## D'Amatos expect second child

Former three-time U.S. Sen. Alfonse D'Amato has earned his share of headlines this year but, for him, none quite so big as this one: D'Amato, 71, is expecting his second child with wife Katuria, 43.

Katuria D'Amato, formerly an attorney in Manhattan with Proskauer Rose, and now a member of the Town of Hempstead Board of Zoning Appeals, concurs.

"The good thing is that Alfonse is at a place in his life where if he wants to take time off he can, and he does, to hang with our little guy." She says the pregnancy was not a surprise. "I so value the relationship I have with my siblings (she has two sisters and a brother) - the shared life and experiences - and I really wanted Alfonso to have that."
