Lawsuit targets Stanford's little helpers: the lawyers

Allen Stanford couldn't have acted alone.

That's the idea behind a lawsuit filed last week by a group of investors he ripped off and the receiver appointed to recover assets for them.

Stanford, of course, was convicted of fraud and is serving a 110-year prison sentence. Two top lieutenants have pleaded guilty, and two others were convicted by a Houston jury last week.

But none possessed the legal, banking and international business expertise to enable Stanford – a former bankrupt gym owner from Mexia – to create a fraud that spanned more than 100 countries and swindled \$7.2 billion from about 30,000 investors.

"How could it be that five people alone could do this?" asked Angela Shaw, head of the Stanford Victims Coalition, which represents investors and is a party to the 172-page lawsuit.

Her answer: They had help. They had lawyers
