Your 78 page fax dated December 3, 2009 labeled as a complaint against Chief Counsel Alan W. Friedberg has been referred to me. Among other things, the document contains copies of letters from you to State Senator John L. Sampson of the New York Senate Judiciary Committee alleging that the DDC has engaged in conflicts of interest, corruption and other wrongful acts. We find no merit in those accusations. In any event, your new "complaint" against Mr. Friedberg provides no basis on which the Committee should pursue action.
