DELRAY BEACH — Police have requested a warrant for the arrest of a lawyer who drove home from a Christmas party in December and rear-ended a car on Congress Avenue, trapping the driver inside. Toxicology tests on blood taken from 55-year-old Christopher Wheeler of the Village of Golf after the crash show that his blood-alcohol level was 0.203 and 0.207 percent, according to police records. That's more than twice the level at which the state presumes a person is too drunk to drive. Wheeler faces a charge of driving under the influence.
