**ORDER SETTING EVIDENTIARY HEARING ON MOTION FOR SANCTIONS**

This matter came before the Court upon the *Motion for Sanctions* [ECF No. 69] (the “Motion”) filed by Joanna Sahm, as personal representative of the estate of Walter Sahm, and Patricia Sahm. The Court initially set the Motion for a non-evidentiary hearing on August 16, 2022. ECF No. 70. However, after further consideration, the Court has determined to set the Motion for a single-day evidentiary hearing.

With the Court being fully advised in the premises, it is ORDERED and ADJUDGED as follows:

1. The non-evidentiary hearing on the Motion scheduled for August 16, 2022, is cancelled.

2. The Court will hold an evidentiary hearing on the Motion [ECF No. 69] commencing at **9:30 a.m. on August 25, 2022**, at the United States Bankruptcy Court, The Flagler Waterview Building, 1515 North Flagler Drive, 8th Floor, Courtroom B, West Palm Beach, Florida 33401. The Court has allotted one court day for the evidentiary hearing. **All persons attending the evidentiary hearing must attend in person.**

3. The parties must exchange exhibits following the procedures set out in Local Rule 9070-1, which is available at this link: <https://www.flsb.uscourts.gov/local-rule/exhibits>. Failure to timely comply with Local Rule 9070-1 may result in denial of admission of evidence.

4. Unless he or she is represented by counsel, each of Joshua Bernstein, Jacob Bernstein, Daniel Bernstein, Eliot Bernstein, and Candice Bernstein may bring a personal laptop and a mobile phone into the courtroom for this evidentiary hearing.
